

Request for Proposals: "Humanities and the Legacy of Race and Ethnicity in United States"

Humanities Texas is pleased to request mini-grant proposals from Texas libraries, museums, and other cultural and educational institutions for public programs that promote meaningful public discussions about the persistent social, economic, cultural, and racial issues that divide our communities.

Awards: The maximum award per applicant for a mini-grant is \$1,500. Partial awards are possible.

Guidelines: Programs must be conducted in a spirit of open and informed inquiry. Humanities scholars must play an active role in their conception, design, and execution. Programs must be free and directed primarily to the general public outside of the regular school or college classroom. Funded programs may not engage in partisan positions nor seek to advance a particular political agenda

Application and program dates: Humanities Texas will accept mini-grant applications on a rolling basis through May 2017. Programs must take place before July 31, 2017.
